

We entered 3 competitions this season - League in Division 5, AFA cup and League cup. Our performance throughout the season was very consistent and exceeded my expectations. In total we played 19 games across 3 competitions, 11 won, 2 drew and 6 lost with a score 61:27. While we were knocked out in both cups in the first round, we ended up third in the league despite having been occupying the second place for the most of the season.

GOALKEEPER



Polytechnic 9s' number #1 goalkeeper choice was **Miltiadis** who played 14 out of 19 games, conceded 20 goals, saved last minute penalty at Alexandra Park and SCORED a goal from the goal kick against Old Salesians! DEFENSE







The most common Poly 9s back four was **Matt** or **Istvan** at right back, **Petr** and **Karl** as centre backs and **Diego** at left back. In total we conceded 27 goals across 3 competitions (19 games). In the League we had second best defense (20 conceded goals) after Old Wilsonians 8s (18 conceded goals). Not only did our defenders successfully eliminate oppositions' attacks but they also managed to score. Petr equalized at Civil Service where we won 5-4, Istvan opened our score at Bank of England (5-2 W), Matt opened the score at home game against Old Wilsonians 9s (6-1 W) and Diego's quick feet scored 2 goals – 1 at Bank of England (5-2 W) and 1 at home against Old Wilsonians 9s (6-1 W).



MIDFIELD







The middle of the park was orchestrated by **Dimitris** and **Nickos**. Both players were new to the team and a great addition to the whole club - both on and off the pitch. The club is even considering introducing Greek food next season after the home games as they noticed they never stayed for meal. Dimitris's thunder shot from 20 yards against Bank of England was one of the finest goals we scored this season. Both midfielders provided our strikers with lethal passes and precise crosses. When Dimitris or Nickos were unavailable **Andy SJ** was a great substitution whose experience and great headers eased up the defenders' work.



WINGS





Jose was another great addition to the team. Having played a left wing he created numerous chances for our strikers and scored 2 goals. It was a big loss for the team when he had to stop playing due to his study commitments. The same applies for Juan – quick and skilful right wing who had the most goal assists. Similarly to Jose it was a big loss for the team when he returned to his home country. Celso and Carlos took up their positions and built on our game.



STRIKERS





What a season for **Arash** it was! He terrorised our oppositions throughout the entire season and managed to score 23 goals for Polytechnic 9s. Never-ending hunger for goals, powerful shots, unstoppable headers, but also quiet few missed chances — that is a summary of the Polytechnic second best goal scorer in the 2014/15 season and a player who did not miss a game and played all 19 competitive games.

Borja - the supersub was our second best striker with 7 goals. When the oppositions were getting tired Borja came on and implemented his fine technical skills to finish them off. Merton, in particular, must have nightmares until now as Borja scored 5 goals against them. Everyone can still remember the one when he produced a fine footwork which could only be seen by Messi in his top form. He dribbled among 4 Merton defenders and then chipped the ball over the keeper to the left top corner.
